Dr. Stacey is a nationally recognized speaker and leader in the healthcare industry. He began his career in Colorado as CEO of St. Vincent General Hospital in Leadville before moving on to become CEO of Poudre Valley Health System and subsequently UC Health. Dr. Stacey most recently served as Managing Director for Navigant Consulting's Healthcare Strategy business unit, where he provided expertise in the areas of organizational transformation, strategy development, and performance leadership.

Dr. Stacey has a BS in Economics and a Masters in Health Administration from Brigham Young University, as well as a PhD in Health Policy from the University of Colorado Denver. He has been the recipient of a number of awards for his efforts to improve the quality of healthcare and was twice named by Modern Healthcare as among the 100 Most Influential People in Healthcare. Dr. Stacey is currently an adjunct faculty member of the University of Minnesota MHA program.

EUGENIE SONTAG SCHOLARSHIP— RECOGNIZING EXCELLENCE IN SERVICE

Megan McCarthy, the 2019 recipient of the Eugenie Sontag Scholarship award, has demonstrated excellence through her professional success, academic achievement, and service to others; a true testament of the qualities the Sontag Award represents.

McCarthy joined the Health Administration program directly after finishing her bachelor's degree in health services administration from the University of South Dakota. A few months after starting the MSHA, she acquired a job working as a Grants Consultant for the Anschutz Medical Campus. She was also elected co-President of the Health Administration Student Organization by her peers. While working full-time and fulfilling her duties as HASO co-President, McCarthy was able to complete the MSHA in 2 years with a 3.9 grade point average.

McCarthy contributes to the Denver Metro Area community and individuals around the world by donating time every week to volunteer at Project C.U.R.E. and The Welcome Table. In her own words McCarthy states,

Volunteering through [Project C.U.R.El allows me to indirectly serve others on a global scale in ways that I would otherwise not be able to do on my own. Alternatively, volunteering at The Welcome Table allows me to serve individuals in our own community that do not have the resources to feed themselves every day. Both volunteering experiences have taught me the importance of giving back to those that are less fortunate because all humans deserve to be treated with dignity and love. >>

The Eugenie Sontag Scholarship Award has been given to a campus health administration student every year since 1975. The award is in honor of Eugenie Sontag, a 1971 health administration graduate who believed in setting an example of excellence and in providing others with love and respect through service. As a nurse, Sontag had been an ensign with the Merchant Marine Hospital in Cleveland and had worked for both the Minneapolis and Denver Visiting Nurse Services. She was instrumental in organizing and developing the Saint Anthony Hospital Auxiliary, and before entering the health administration program, she had served as a nursing home administrator. After graduating from the program, she learned she had inoperable lung cancer. Sontag passed away in 1972, after which the Eugenie Sontag Scholarship Award was established in her memory and honor.

Criteria for the award includes the candidate's academic standing, record of community service, leadership or professional promise, and significant achievement potential in the health care field. Health administration faculty members nominate four to six students to be considered for the award. The Colorado Health Administration Alumni Association Board of Directors then makes the final decision.

BAYLOR UNIVERSITY HOSTS 5TH CASE COMPETITION IN HEALTHCARE MANAGEMENT

Graduate students from universities across the nation converged at Baylor University

October 23-25, 2019, to compete in the fifth annual Robbins Case Competition in Healthcare Management. The Robbins Institute for Health Policy and Leadership at Baylor's Hankamer School of Business hosts the competition to provide a forum for master's degree-level students to participate in a national case competition in healthcare management with a distinct financial and quantitative emphasis.

Winners of the competition earned national recognition plus monetary awards. Trinity University's team took first place and \$12,000. University of Pittsburgh earned second place and \$8,000. University of Alabama at Birmingham garnered third place and \$4,000.

Three students were awarded \$500 each for the best responses in the question and answer session in the three preliminary round panels. The winners were Lajvanthi Sudhaker from Saint Louis University, Maddie Haftel from Cornell University, and Josh Williams from the University of Toronto.

Best presenters, who earned \$500 each, were chosen from each of three preliminary round panels. The winners included Tiffany Daniel from the Ohio State University, Nikola Yerkan from Rush University, and Christina Fortugno from the University of Alabama at Birmingham.

The 6th Annual Robbins Case Competition in Healthcare Management will be held October 28–30, 2020, at the Paul L. Foster Campus for Business and Innovation at Baylor University.

Errol Biggs, PhD,
FACHE joined the Health
Administration Faculty 41
years ago in January 1978
and remained with the
program as it moved from
the CU Medical School to
the Business School in 1982.
He was Interim Director of
the Health Administration
Programs in 1992 and then
assumed the position of
Director in 1997 and served
faithfully until his retirement in
July 2019.

CU Denver students know Dr. Biggs best for his Profiles in Healthcare class, where

he arranged for nationally known healthcare leaders to lecture on current topics in healthcare and network with the students. Many of his students received jobs from the contacts made in his Profiles class.

During Dr. Biggs' time as Director of the campus and executive programs in health administration, both programs achieved national rankings among the top 25 graduate programs in healthcare management by US News & World Report.

In addition to his service to the University of Colorado Denver, Dr. Biggs had a successful career in both investorowned and non-profit hospital industries, including a twelve year term as the CEO of large teaching hospitals. During which, he directed the first merger between osteopathic and allopathic hospitals in the United States. Dr. Biggs sits on a number of hospital boards and is the author of three books on healthcare governance. He is a faculty member of the American Hospital Association's Center for Healthcare Governance and Chairman of the Practical Governance Group, both of which offer educational programs for hospital governing boards.

Dr. Biggs received his MBA in Health Administration in 1969 from George Washington University and his PhD in Healthcare Administration in 1977 from Pennsylvania State University.

Dr. Biggs plans to continue to consult and partake in healthcare governance, as well as keep up his squash game in his retirement. He and his wife, Alison, look forward to spending their free time traveling.

WELCOME NEW FACULTY

Wayne Cascio, PhD is a Distinguished University Professor at the University of Colorado. He holds the Robert H. Reynolds Chair in Global Leadership at the University of Colorado Denver. He has served as president of the Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology (1992-1993), Chair of the SHRM Foundation (2007), the HR Division of the Academy of Management (1984), and as a member of the Academy of Management's Board of Governors (2003-2006). Currently, he serves as an editor of the Journal of International Business Studies (JIBS).

He has authored or edited 31 books on Human Resource Management, including Managing Human Resources (11th ed., 2019), Investing in People (with John Boudreau and Alexis Fink, 3rd ed., 2019), Applied Psychology in Talent Management (with Herman Aguinis, 8th ed., 2019), and The Oxford Handbook of Talent Management (co-edited with David Collings & Kamel Mellahi, 2017). He is a two-time winner of the best-paper award from the Academy of Management Executive for his research on downsizing.

In 2010 he received the Michael R. Losey Human Resources Research Award from the Society for Human Resource Management, in 2013 he received the Distinguished Scientific Contributions Award from the Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology, and in 2016 the World Federation of People Management Associations awarded him its Lifetime Achievement Award. From 2011-2013 he served as Chair of the U.S. Technical Advisory Group that is developing international HR standards, and he represented the United States to the International Organization for Standards. Currently, he serves as Chair of the SHRM Certification Commission. He is an elected Fellow of the National Academy of Human Resources, the Academy of Management, the American Psychological Association, and the Australian HR Institute.

Dr. Cascio received his BA Psychology from the College of Holy Cross, an MA Experimental Psychology from Emory University, and PhD Industrial/Organizational Psychology from the University of Rochester. He co-teaches a course on human resources management with Andy Garmen, PsyD in the Executive program.



Arlen Meyers, MD, MBA is President and CEO of the Society of Physician Entrepreneurs Graduate School Faculty at University of Colorado–Denver and a professor emeritus in otolaryngology, dentistry and engineering at the University of Colorado Denver School of Medicine and the Colorado School of Public Health.

He was named by Modern Healthcare as one of the 50 Most Influential Physician Executives of 2011 and nominated in 2012, and as one of the Best Doctors in 2013. Dr. Meyers is associate editor of the Journal of Commercial Biotechnology and Technology Transfer and Entrepreneurship and editor-in-chief of Medscape Reference: Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery. He completed a Fulbright at Kings Business, the commercialization office of technology transfer at Kings College in London.

Some of his publications include "Building the Case for Biotechnology," "Optical Detection of Cancer", and "The Life Science Innovation Roadmap".

Dr. Meyers teaches a course on healthcare innovation in the Executive program.
